4. INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES:

Academic infrastructure:

All the class rooms, Drawing Halls, Laboratories, Workshops, A computer centre housing more than 700 computers, named 'Tech Lounge', launched in 2017, after 20 years of experience gained in various academic activities, 15 Centres of Excellence and newly created AICTE-IDEA FACTORY, Administrative block and a Reception Desk for internal co-ordination and to guide the visitors to the college are accommodated in an overall built up area of more than 8 lakhs Sq.ft. A computer laboratory with 120 computers in the Academic Sciences Block, for all first year students and separate computer laboratory for each department are also available

Lecture Capturing System

REC, being an institution constantly updating the procedures and practice in tune with growing technology, has introduced for the first time in Chennai, a Lecture Capturing System (LCS) in 2019, as a part of digital transformation, to modernise the teaching methods of the faculty and to enhance the learning experience of the students. Currently, 65 classrooms are integrated with REC-LCS and the students can access the class room lecture content anytime, anywhere and can learn at their own pace by simply logging in to the REC-LCS. Also 60 class rooms are provided with smart TV panels, enabling presentation of PPTs and video lectures.

A hi-tech computer lab with 210 Desktop PCs equipped with the latest Intel i7 and i5 11th Gen Processor, 16 GB RAM and 4 GB Graphics Card is established on the third floor of the research block to meet the industry 4.0 curriculum and to cope up with the latest Computer Science trends including Artificial Intelligence, Edge Computing, Machine Learning, Data Science, etc.

Centres of Excellence and their Activities

Rajalakshmi Engineering College (REC) has established 15 Centers of Excellence in the campus, engaged in transformative endeavors in various technical domains.

Among the earliest ones, the Center for Machine Vision (CEMV) and MEMS and Micro-fluidics (CEMM) are carrying out research activities in these emerging areas, including funded projects and industrial consultancies. Serving as pioneering platforms, these centers not only foster research but also facilitate industrial training of faculty and students aligned with their academic specialties.

The Center for Digital Manufacturing, equipped with cutting-edge facilities like Industrial 3D Scanners with Blue Light Technology, is presently involved in a project on "Technology Interventions for Indigenous Handcrafted Products of Tamil Nadu", sponsored by the Department of Science & Technology. The Center for Fluid Dynamics caters to the needs of the aerospace and automotive industries, simulating heat and fluid flow challenges for both civil and defense sectors.

REC's Centers of Excellence in Renewable Energy and Electric Vehicles have developed PV-powered Electric Scooters and going ahead with experiments on solar power grid applications. The Center for Sustainable Construction Materials is doing pioneering work on eco-friendly building materials, for societal and industrial benefits.

Promoting data-driven problem-solving research and industrial consultancy, the Center for Data Science focuses on effective solutions for several problems using modern concepts. The Center for Embedded Technology facilitates interdisciplinary research and development in ubiquitous computing systems. Exploring smart systems and intelligent technologies, the loT centre advances scientific discovery.

The Center of Excellence in Biofilms develops novel anti-biofilm therapeutics, while educating students in this Biofilm field. The center for Medical Imaging tackles imaging challenges and deals with innovative Albased modalities in the medical diagnostic realm. Bridging gaps between food industries and society, the Center for Food Product Development and Process Design enriches education, research, and skills in this field.

Advancing the study of high-speed jet flows, this Center conducts research on passive flow control methods and noise suppression techniques. The Center for Assistive Technologies develops suitable gadgets for special children and differently-abled individuals, to enable them for leading a comfortable life.

The institution's commitment to entrepreneurship spans digital agriculture, healthcare, sustainable transportation, and more, with a research funding exceeding Rs. 20 crores and Rs. 4.5 crores from industrial consultancies,

Our college is one of the three institutions in Tamil Nadu to secure funding under the FIST by DST in 21-22. An amount of Rs.1.37 crores has been sanctioned for establishing sophisticated analytical instrumentation lab for Bio science.

Recognized as a Host Institution by MSME, REC bolsters young entrepreneurs through infrastructure and funding support. Participation in the MSME Idea Hackathon has recently yielded 4 selected ideas, for a total funding of 1.38 crores, showcasing REC's innovation prowess.

AICTE-IDEA Factory

An AICTE-IDEA Factory has been established at REC and it is equipped with a wide range of modern tools, components and equipment, enabling students, faculty members, research scholars and industry personnel to explore and develop cutting-edge technologies. To cite, some of these emerging areas:

Drone Technology dealing with unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs), incorporating AI algorithms and high-resolution cameras, capturing visuals, even in inaccessible locations; PCB based control circuits employing necessary hardware tools and Mach3 CNC software, essentially required in the fabrication of all the modern sophisticated equipment and gadgets; IoT which has the potential to transform various sectors in this modern world, by enhancing efficiency, productivity and sustainability; Recent developments in Laser Cutting, CNC Router Machines, 3D Scanning and 3D printing, also known as additive manufacturing, making it ideally suited for rapid prototyping of complex models applied in varied automotive.

industries, including robotics, railways and medical implant devices in manufacturing sectors.

This IDEA Factory becomes a significant addition to our rapidly growing Engineering institution, enabling the students to work on innovative ideas, designing, fabricating and testing new products. These planned activities will create new placement opportunities and avenues for start-ups and provide support and guidance to the students to become successful entrepreneurs.

Isaac Asimov Robotic Laboratory

The Isaac Asimov Robotic Laboratory is established to give students handson experience in designing, building, programming, and testing robots for a wide variety of applications. The lab is equipped with Sophisticated Conveyor Tracking System Using Mitsubishi 6 axis Industrial Robot, Lightweight Intelligent Training Robotic Arm and Autonomous mobile robot, 30 numbers of hi-end Desktop PCs to train the students in robotic systems for performing various industrial operations.

Industry Institute Interaction Cell

Consultancy service is a well recognized and an effective way for an academic institution to expand the knowledge horizon and bridging the gap between industry and academia, by providing innovative solutions, by signing suitable MoUs. The cell is actively involved in offering solutions in various domains which includes IoT based Smart Boat, development of oleoresins from organic matters, micro biological testing for paint samples and in other web and mobile applications.

Co-Curricular Activities:

Apart from the regular academic programmes, students are given lot of opportunities for taking up projects and participating in national and international competitions, presenting papers in symposia/ Conferences, attending workshops and seminars in emerging topics for enhancing their technical knowledge and skills. Recently, REC hosted a national level Drone Development Challenge competition. More than 800 students from reputed engineering institutions across the country participated in this event. REC students' team also took part and won an award in the Innovation category in Drone Development.

There are also several Professional Societies actively functioning and there is an Entrepreneurship Development Cell which train students interested in Entrepreneurial ventures, by enabling them to innovate new ideas for their self-employment.

International Partnerships

REC has active and functional MoUs with several leading Universities in India as well as abroad through which our faculty members and students participate in faculty exchange programs and students internship.

Sports and Games:

These activities are integral part of the institution and the students have been performing well in the intramural and intercollegiate tournaments and sports meets. Apart from the courts and fields for all the regular games and sports events, a Futsal football, Pickle-ball and Squash courts have been created recently, to encourage the players interested in these games, to gain the skills and confidence in handling the ball.

Hostels:

There are boys and girls hostels in campus. The Principal is the Chief Warden for all these hostels and the in-house management of the hostels is looked after by the respective Deputy Wardens, with students' representatives. There are also facilities for quality health care, 24 hour power back up, ATM and laundry.

Faculty and Administration

Rajalakshmi Engineering College ensures that adequate number of experienced and well qualified faculty members is available in all the departments with large number of them holding Ph.D. degree. All the administrative and supporting sections of the college are also very well organized.

Training and Placement

6. LIBRARY

- 1. The College Library possesses a collection of over 62,840 volumes, 13,972 titles on various disciplines of Engineering and other subjects. The library subscribes to 260 national and 390 international print journals and 2,290 E-journals for the use of faculty and students. In addition, 4083 Journal back volumes, 5230 project and Ph.D. thesis and magazines are available.
- The library has a separate 'Electronics Resources Wing' with more than 4187 CD ROMS, digital library and remote access for online ejournals and e-books.
- The books are arranged and classified according to the Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme. Open Access System is followed in the library.

- 4. The college is an institutional member of the Anna University Library, DELNET, MALIBNET, NDL and Institution of Engineers India, in order to facilitate the staff and students to have access to the resources from these libraries also.
- 5. All students and staff are members of the college library.

The rules to be observed are as follows: the unique aim of framing these rules is to ensure the library usage is to its fullest extent.

- 1. All members shall sign in the register provided at the entrance as a token of their acceptance to adhere to the rules of the library.
- Under no circumstances, personal books, files and other articles (except a small note book or loose sheets of paper) will be allowed inside the library.
- 3. Strict silence shall always be maintained in the library.
- 4. Any marking or writing in the books by the members is strictly prohibited.
- Members are solely responsible for any damage caused to the books or other property in the library and in that case, they must make arrangement to replace them.
- 6. Misbehaviour in the library will lead to cancellation of membership and also to serious disciplinary action.
- 7. Use of mobile phones not permitted inside the Library. If possessed it should in SWITCHED OFF mode.
- 8. Notwithstanding these rules, in all matters, the decision of the authorities of this institution will be final.

LIBRARY CARDS:

1. The issue of library cards is regulated as follows:

Under Graduate Students - 4 Cards

Post Graduate Students - 4 Cards

Teaching Staff - 4 Cards

Non - Teaching Staff - 2 Cards

- 2. Student members can obtain membership cards from the library only on producing their identity cards.
- 3. Library cards are not transferable.
- 4. Only one book can be borrowed on each card.
- 5. Members are responsible for all the books borrowed on their cards.
- 6. Student members have to produce identity cards along with library cards at the time of borrowing books.
- 7. The books borrowed from the college library should be returned by the students at the end of the academic year and "No Dues Certificate" must be obtained. Staff members leaving the college by resignation etc., should also return the books borrowed from the library and "No Dues Certificate" must be obtained.
- 8. Loss of Library cards should be reported to the Librarian in writing.
- Duplicate cards will be issued on payment of penalty of Rs.200/- for each card and on an undertaking that the member concerned will continue to be held responsible for any loss arising from misuse of the lost card

ISSUE AND RETURN OF BOOKS:

- Books other than reference books and periodicals will be issued to student members for a period of 14 days. For teachers, the period of issue is two months.
- 2. Two renewals of books will be allowed provided there are no reservations against these books. For renewals, members must present books in person.
- 3. Before leaving the issue counter, members must satisfy themselves that books issued to them are in good condition. Any damage to the book should be immediately reported to the Librarian, failing which, the members to whom the book is issued, will be held responsible for the damage.
- 4. Books which are in demand may be issued for a short period and books lent may also be called at any time.
- 5. Absence from college will not be permitted as an excuse for delay in returning the books.

Over Due Charges:

 For default of return of books on the due dates indicated on the slips, the following rates of overdue charges will be levied.

- 2. First week Rs. 1/- per day and second week onwards Rs. 5/- per day.
- 3. If a book is not returned within eight weeks from the due date, the cost of books plus overdue charges will be levied.

LOSS OF BOOKS:

- 1. Loss of books, if any, should be reported to the Librarian immediately and it shall be replaced by the borrower with another good copy.
- 2. If the borrower is unable to replace the book lost within the time fixed, twice the cost of the book lost, plus over due charges will be levied.

RESERVATION OF BOOKS:

Reservation of books which have been issued already is possible. The reserved books after their return will be kept at the counter for two consecutive days for issue to those who have reserved them. If they fail to collect the said books within two days, these books will be issued to the members in waiting list.

Other Facilities

- 1. Provision for photocopying and printing.
- 2. Audio and visual rooms for specialized lectures, NPTEL and for research presentations.
- 3. Special seating arrangements and sign-language trained persons are available for physically challenged members.
- 4. Separate facility with licensed software available for checking plagiarism of the research paper, before submitting for peer review.
- 5. Other language books (National 4, foreign language 4) are available.
- 6. New arrivals and current awareness are displayed periodically.

Transport

- There are 101 routes and college runs 92 AC buses presently, providing transport facility to the students and staff from various places in the Chennai city and also covering Tiruvallur, Kancheepuram, Vellore, Ranipet, Tiruvannamalai and Chengalpattu districts.
- 2. The number of buses is increased corresponding to the increase in the intake of students.
- 3. The route details are available in the college website

7. RULES AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED IN THE COLLEGE

Rajalakshmi Engineering College is imparting the best technical education and also inculcates discipline among the students so that they are trained as excellent engineers.

A. General:

- 1. The College normally works from 8.00 am to 3.00 pm.
- Students are required to be regular and punctual to the classes, laboratories and training and placement sessions etc. Students are expected to be in the class / specified venue at least 5 minutes before the commencement of the period / session. This applies to day scholars as well as hostel students.
- 3. To maintain order and discipline, students arriving after 8.00 a.m. will not be permitted to enter the campus.
- 4. The students should adhere to the break timings and be in the class room/laboratories/other specified venues on time after the break.
- 5. Students should maintain perfect order and strict silence inside the Lecture hall/Drawing hall/Seminar hall/Laboratory/ Workshop/Library.
- 6. The Students are NOT permitted to use their mobile phones anywhere in the academic blocks, Laboratories, library, Seminar Halls etc. They are advised to keep the mobile phones in SWITCHED OFF mode.

However, the students are permitted to use their mobile phone for making emergency calls during their official break timings outside the academic blocks.

Any violation of this instruction will lead to confiscation of mobile phone. Mobile phones once confiscated will not be returned at all. No representation in this regard will be entertained.

Possession, usage of mobile phones, electronic gadgets such as smart watches, blue tooth and any other communicative devices, whether in ON/OFF mode is strictly prohibited inside the examination hall. Strict disciplinary action will be initiated against the defaulters besides confiscation of such devices.

Using mobile phone for playing video games, viewing movies, listening to songs etc. anywhere, anytime inside the campus during college hours will lead to the confiscation of mobile phones.

Taking photographs using mobile phones or any other gadgets inside the college campus, without prior permission from competent authorities is a punishable offence.

- 7. The students should sit in the class room in an orderly manner, occupying from the front desk onwards. Unnecessary movement from one bench to another bench inside the class room should be avoided. Any student who behaves in such a way that distracts others and disrupts the teaching process, such students will be sent to the Principal's office and suitable action will be initiated. During college working hours, students can visit the library only during library periods mentioned in their time table or during official break timings.
- 8. Movement outside the class room in between Lectures should be a minimum and for valid reasons only, with the permission in writing by the concerned faculty / Academic Guardian/ HOD. Students should not loiter around during the class, Lab., Library, Seminar hours, Guest lectures, Training & placement sessions etc. Playing of games and any sports activities will be allowed only with the permission of Physical Education Director during college working hours.
- 9. Students should not celebrate any function by themselves like Friends day, Birthday, Valentine's Day, Teachers' day, Final Day of any semester, New Year etc., within the college campus. Possession and use of crackers, on any occasion, either inside the campus or areas leading to the campus / hostel / college bus is strictly prohibited.
- 10. Students should not indulge in touching / tampering with CCTV cameras, Lecture Capturing system, interactive panels, PA system, and LED displays installed in the college / hostel / college bus etc. Students found to have caused any damage to any of the assets of the college (equipment or furniture or any other infrastructure), apart from being penalized to recover the cost of the damages, will also face disciplinary action. Possession and use of lethal weapons is strictly banned inside the college campus / hostel / college bus and it is a punishable offence. Students should avoid over loading of Lifts, and cause any damage to them. It may also disrupt its movement and cause it to get stuck between floors.
- 11. Writing on the desks in the class rooms and on the walls and lifts or sitting on the parapet wall, defacing of college property should be totally avoided. Waste materials should be put in the dust bins provided. Littering in the campus/ college bus/ hostel premises will invite penalty. Students are expected to cultivate the habits of maintaining a clean and green campus.
- 12. Entry into and Exit from the College and hostel should only be through

- designated points / gates only. While doing so, if asked for, they should produce /prove their identity by showing their identity card. Riding Scooters / Motorcycles inside the campus is not permitted.
- 13. Possession, consumption, demand and supply of alcohol or any form of narcotic substances or smoking or chewing of tobacco in any form inside the campus, Hostel, College Bus etc., is strictly prohibited and it is a punishable offence.
- 14. Students forming groups to organize, support, involve in any form of protest / demands should be strictly avoided. Students getting involved in physical altercation will be liable for severe punitive action. Students involving outsiders to settle issues, creating unwanted social media groups / posting offensive messages will also be liable for punishment.
- 15. Posting any picture / photo / text pertaining to faculty, staff or student or building / portion of building in the campus in digital media or in any other form of public domain is a serious offence and will lead to disciplinary action.
- 16. The use of any media in any form to malign/ defame/ bully/troll/stalk any fellow students, faculty, staff members and college in general is a punishable offence, leading to initiation of legal proceedings.
- 17. Students should avoid use of any kind of social media that involve collection and contribution of money in any mode and for any purpose connected with the college, third party vendors training agencies, project centre, etc in the campus / off campus, is strictly prohibited unless authorized by the college authorities.
- 18. Under specific circumstances, the college authorities reserve the right to initiate search operations to check any student's personnel belongings such as bags, mobile phones, electronic gadgets and their vehicles at any time.
- Students are advised to contact class in charge, class counselor, HOD, Dean or the Principal in case they need any special requirement.
- 20. If Day scholars remain in the campus after the college hours for attending special classes / laboratory / Library / Co - Curricular / Extracurricular activities etc., they are expected to remain in the respective area of activity only. Unauthorized and unwanted stay back for any personal reasons will not be permitted.

21. Students should not indulge any activity unbecoming of the student inside the campus/college bus and hostel premises. Such conduct and misbehavior is punishable offence and liable for expulsion from the college/ hostel.

B. Identity Cards:

- Students should wear their identity card inside the campus and in the College Bus.
- 2. The identity card is a property of the college and has to be produced on demand by the college authorities.
- 3. Identity Card relates to individual identity only and should not be misused by others. If misused, strict disciplinary action will be taken.
- Loss / Damage / Defaced identity cards should be reported immediately in writing to the Principal and fresh ID Card may be obtained from the administration department by paying the prescribed fees.
- In case, the original ID card is not brought for Unit tests/ CAT / University examinations / End semester Examinations, students can secure temporary ID card from the administration office by paying the prescribed charges. The validity of this temporary ID card is for that day only.
- 6. The following are the charges related to ID cards:
 - (i) Rs. 30/= for tag and Rs. 20/= for holder
 - (ii) Rs.100/= for damaged/defaced/any correction
 - (iii) Rs.100/= temporary ID card with one day validity
 - (iv) Rs. 100/= for loss of ID card final semester students and Rs. 500/= for all others. A Student should not apply for new ID card if the one already issued has been handed over to a faculty / staff / for some issues.
 - (v) Rs.200/- for possession / sharing / wearing Identity Card of other students on any occasion.
- 7. Possession of fake/ photocopy / Xerox of identity cards is objectionable and action will be initiated and a fine of Rs. 750/=will be levied.

C. Transportation Facility:

1. Mobile phone and any other electronic gadgets to be used with Head /

Ear phone only and should not cause any disturbance to the cotravelers.

- 2. Students should board/alight the bus only at the designated points. Students are advised to be at the boarding point atleast 10 minutes before scheduled time of arrival to get into the bus at that point. They should avoid getting in / getting down after the bus has started moving. Students should not unnecessarily move around inside the bus during the journey. Foot board travel is strictly prohibited. The students will not be permitted to alight enroute, during onward journey to the college. Holding up of bus journey for any reasons not approved by the Faculty / Staff In Charge of the bus will lead to taking disciplinary action.
- 3. The seating arrangements allotted for the girl students, boy students and for the staff to be followed.
- 4. The hostel students may avail the college bus facilities while they are going on leave or in an emergency, with valid leave/gate pass subject to the availability of seats in the college bus.
- 5. As stipulated in the campus, the students should refrain from any undesirable activity inside the college bus such as shouting, dancing, ragging, any unruly behavior, indulging in any activity that creates nuisance for fellow passengers, celebrations of any festivals, bus day, birthday, send off parties etc. or contributing and collecting money for any such celebration. Carrying of inflammable materials /Fire crackers in the college bus is strictly prohibited and severe disciplinary action will be initiated if this rule is violated.
- 6. Students are advised to keep the conversation with fellow passenger at levels which do not cause unwanted distraction / disturbances for others travelling in the bus. Student should avoid defacing / damaging of bus property. Such action will lead to payment of penalty to recover the cost of the damages as assessed by the college authorities.
- 7. The instructions given by the Bus in-charge, faculty and staff members traveling in the college bus, should be strictly followed. Under no circumstances, the students should enter into any argument with the drivers or disturb or distract them while they are driving the vehicle. violations will be viewed seriously.
- Students should avoid chasing college buses and attempt to halt them
 at points, not approved by the Transport department. This kind of
 violation is viewed seriously and strict disciplinary action will be
 initiated.

9. Discipline, good manners and cleanliness should always be maintained in the college bus.

D. Use of personal Two wheelers/ cars:

Students are strongly advised to avoid driving two wheelers or cars to commute, since driving in the highways is highly risky.

E. Dress Code:

The students are expected to maintain a decent dress code as follows in the campus on all occasions:

- Boys: Formal full length pant covering the ankles (which can even be a
 decent jeans pant but not toned /stylish / ripped jeans pant), Formal
 shirt (which can even be a decent T. Shirt with sleeves and Collar) and
 Formal Shoes/Sandals but not flip-flop / slippers. Students should
 avoid wearing studs, bracelets, etc.
- Girls: Churidhars with Dhupatta properly pinned on both sides and formal shoes or Formal full length pant covering the ankles (which can even be a decent jeans pant but not toned /stylish /ripped jeans pant), Knee length upper garment and formal Shoes/Sandals but not flip-flop / slippers.
- Boys and Girls: White coat with Black Shoes for all Laboratories except Computer Laboratory. Gray coat and shoes for workshop practice.

Dress code must be adhered strictly in class rooms and laboratories during regular working days, special classes, assessment tests, end semester examinations, project sessions and any other activity inside the college campus.

The students are expected to wear dresses as appropriate to an educational institution and avoid distracting unprofessional look.

F. Attendance Requirements:

- 1. The college will work for 90 teaching days in every Semester of the academic year.
- Ideally every student is expected to attend all classes of all the courses and secure 100% attendance. However, in order to give provision for certain unavoidable reasons such as medical / participation in Co-Curricular / Extra- curricular, the student is expected to attend a minimum of 75% of the classes for every course of the semester.
- 3. The Students should not be absent/take leave without prior permission

from the Head of the Department concerned. Any unauthorized absence will be viewed seriously and liable for punishment. If anyone is absent due to unavoidable reasons, it should be informed to the Class Teacher by phone/mobile/through college email, followed by a leave letter.

- 4. Students who are absent on unavoidable medical reasons, should inform the HOD and get oral permission over the phone. The approval of this medical leave should be obtained from the Principal positively on the day of reporting to the college, after submission of relevant medical records.
- 5. If any student is on unauthorized absence for a continuous period of FIVE days, he/she shall be deemed to have been removed from the rolls of the college. Such students may be readmitted provided:
 - (i) A request is made to the Principal explaining the reasons for his/her absence;
 - (ii) The Principal is fully satisfied about the genuineness of the explanation
 - (iii) after paying a readmission fee of Rs.1,500/-
- 6. Parents are informed through SMS, in case their ward is absent for the college on any day.

G. Academic Standards:

- 1. Students should attend all tests with good preparation and show good academic progress. Willful and unauthorized absence will be taken as a serious deviation and will be penalized suitably.
- 2. Consistent high level of performance of students in all the tests is emphasized for maintaining good academic standard.
- 3. Students should be attentive in the class. They should bring calculators every day and drawing instruments and charts whenever needed. Observation notebook should also be brought to the laboratory classes regularly. Record of experiments done in a particular class should be submitted in the next laboratory class. Those who do not submit assignments and record note books in time will not be eligible for attendance.
- 4. Students should maintain high ethical standards in all their academic activities also, refrain from indulging in any malpractice in the offline/online examinations. They should avoid plagiarism, maintain originality in all their assignments, technical paper and project report.

- writing and publications. Severe disciplinary action will be initiated against the defaulters and appropriate punitive action will be taken.
- 5. Students should go through all the regulations governing the autonomous programme, stated in the book Regulations 2023 and be familiar with all of them.

8. Rules and Regulations for Hostel Inmates

Students who are desirous of availing hostel facilities/renewal of hostel facilities should give their option to stay in the hostel in the prescribed form.

- 1. Students must occupy the rooms allotted to them by the Hostel Manager/Dy. Warden.
- 2. Ragging is strictly prohibited anywhere inside as well as outside the hostel campus. If anyone is found to have indulged in ragging, he / she will attract severe punishment as per Supreme Court order and laws in force.
- 3. Students must be present in their respective rooms before the attendance is taken or close of students' outing time.
- 4. Students should not be absent from the hostel without prior permission from the Principal / Hostel Manager / Dy.Warden. Consequences of any such violation will be solely on the parents and the student, besides initiation of disciplinary action.
- 5. Students should report to the Dy.Warden on or before the permitted time, without fail.
- 6. At the time of returning to the hostel after the vacation period / availing leave, the students should enter the college and hostel strictly between 6.00 a.m and 6.00 p.m. only, by appropriate planning of the travel time, except on very unavoidable reasons, which should be reported to the Hostel Manager through the Dy. Warden.
- Students who do not return to the Hostel within the permitted time on more than three occasions will be removed from the Rolls of the Hostel. Such students will be readmitted at the sole discretion of the Principal and on the payment of Rs.2000/- towards readmission fee.
- 8. Parents are requested to authorize the local guardian / visitors to visit the students in the hostel and none other than the authorized person will be permitted to visit the student in the campus.
- Students will not be allowed to leave the Hostel based on any phone calls unless authorized by the Principal / Dean Student Affairs / Hostel Manager / Dy. Warden. Students leaving the hostel without proper

- permission in writing, will be suspended from the hostel immediately. Such students can get readmission into the hostel at the end of the suspension period, by paying readmission fee of Rs. 25,000/-,
- 10. Students will be permitted to visit their native place / local guardians once a month with prior permission. Student's not returning back to Hostel on time will forgo outing for the next 30 days from the date of reporting.
- 11. Students will not be permitted to avail any leave / outing in weekends proceeding CAT / End Semester exams. Any special permission during this period is at the sole discretion of the Principal.
- 12. Students should maintain a friendly behavior with fellow hostel inmates. Students should refrain from all anti-social and undesirable activities such as altercation, manhandling etc., Such activities will be treated as an offence and will be liable for expulsion from the hostel.
- 13. Possession, consumption, demand and supply of alcohol, or any form of narcotic drugs, or smoking or chewing of tobacco, gambling, ragging etc., is strictly prohibited in the hostel premises. Strict disciplinary action will be initiated against the violations.
- Any Student intending to attend any family function or any other ceremony will be permitted only with the approval of the college authorities.
- 15. Students should focus only on their studies during the prescribed study hours and should not create any sort of disturbance to others. Absolute silence shall be maintained. Defaulters will be liable for punishments.
- Students having any grievance should report to the Dy.Warden and should not deal with the problem directly with other students or hostel / mess staff.
- 17. Electrical fittings and furniture should be returned in good conditions as they were, when occupied. Any damage at the time of occupation of the room should be reported to the Hostel Manager in writing immediately. Failure to do so will result in collection of necessary charges from the inmates.
- 18. Unauthorized electrical fittings and gadgets are strictly prohibited inside the Hostel rooms.
- 19. Students should switch off the electricity and water taps when not in use and avoid wastage of electricity and water.

- 20. Students are responsible for maintaining their rooms clean and service of the house keeping staff may be availed as and when needed.
- 21. Any sort of misbehavior inside or outside the hostel campus will warrant expulsion from the hostel immediately without notice.
- 22. Display of any type of objectionable posters / calendars/use of social media for such activities inside the hostel premises is strictly prohibited. Anyone found violating this rule shall be fined Rs.500/- the first time. Any further violation will be severely dealt with.
- 23. The use of digital or any media in any form to malign/ defame/ bully/troll/stalk any fellow inmates, faculty, staff members and college in general is a punishable offence leading to initiate of legal proceedings.
- 24. Any act of intimidation or violence, willful damage to property, drunken, riotous behavior constitutes an offence. If anybody found to do so, he/she shall be liable for expulsion from the hostel.
- Students should avoid keeping any vehicle or costly items with them.
 They should keep their belongings safely and at their own responsibility.
- 26. Mess utensils will be provided to the students. However, the inmates may also bring their own utensils like tumblers, plates etc., for their use.
- 27. Students are advised to avoid food wastage in the mess.
- 28. In no case, residents can enter the kitchen either to collect food or communicate any grievances regarding food with kitchen staff. Grievances should be recorded in the register maintained for the purpose.
- 29. Finger print impression is mandatory for all the inmates in the hostel premises and hostel mess.
- 30. Hostel facility should be availed for the full year only and not for part of the year.
- Hostel fees shall be paid in full before entering in the hostel. No refund of hostel fees will be made, if Hostel is vacated in the middle of the Academic year.
- 32. Students should vacate the Hostel after the completion of the even semester exams and can rejoin in the next academic year on full payment of Hostel fees. No student shall enter the Hostel campus without obtaining the renewal of hostel admission in writing.

- 33. Students should compulsorily make use of Laundromat for washing of clothes as per the existing rules.
- 34. Students should not organize / celebrate any function / occasions within the hostel campus without the prior permission from the Principal / Dean Student Affairs / Hostel Manager / Dy. Warden. Possession and use of Fire crackers, on any occasion either inside the Hostel campus or areas leading to the campus is strictly prohibited. Students should avoid over loading of the lift and causing damage to its functioning. Students found to have caused any damage to the assets of the College / Hostel (equipment or furniture or any other infrastructure) will face disciplinary action, besides being penalized to recover the cost of the damages. Possession and use of lethal weapons is strictly banned and is punishable offence.
- 35. The hostel inmates are to leave hostel rooms/hostel mess 15 minutes before the commencement of 1st period of class. Hostel students will not be permitted to re-enter hostel premises during the class hours except on medical grounds or any other genuine reason authorized by the college authorities.
- 36. Students are not permitted to stay back in Hostel during class Hours. Can be permitted to stay back only when they fell sick, with the prior approval from Dy.Warden / Duty Doctor.
- 37. Unauthorized stay inside the hostel during class hours will be viewed seriously.
- 38. Day scholars are not allowed to visit the hostels on any account. Day scholars dining in the Hostel mess will be penalized. Hostel inmates found to have invited and entertained the dayscholar in the hostel will also be penalized.
- 39. Hostel students are to maintain dress code as prescribed by the college, while they visit campus for any purpose, cafeteria during college working hours.

Games Timings:

On working days, games timings: 3.30 pm to 5.50 pm.

Study Timings:

Students should maintain absolute silence during study time.

Hostel Mess:

Hostel Mess is run by the Management through private contractors, under the guidance of the Principal and Administrative Officers. Vegetarian food is served in the hostel. Mess charges are collected on an annual basis, before the commencement of the academic year. The following mess timings should be strictly adhered to by all the inmates.

The college reserves the rights to change / amend the rules and regulations apart from introducing new rules and regulations from time to time, as and when the situation warrants, without prior intimation.





20. Safety Guidelines for the Students


All the students are advised to strictly adhere to the following safety guidelines:
